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## INTRODUCTION

#### **ABOUT**

Michigan Breastfeeding Network (MIBFN) presents the Great Lakes Breastfeeding Webinars, monthly free continuing education offerings available on-demand to watch whenever and wherever for up to one year after the initial air date. The webinars center Black and Indigenous presenters with a variety of topics covered related to human milk feeding.

MIBFN collaborates with organizations and individuals to bring about actionable, system-level changes that are centered on the diverse experiences of Michigan families with young children. They advocate, educate, and community-build alongside families and organizations for the advancement of an equitable, just, and breastfeeding-supportive culture.

#### **GROUNDING OUR EFFORTS**

In planning and implementation of these webinars, we are grounding our efforts in this working definition of racial equity:

Disparities in breastfeeding are perpetuated by inequities that have historically and currently centered white people and their experiences. Racial equity in breastfeeding is both a process and an outcome. The process of working towards racial equity in breastfeeding involves purposefully decentering white supremacy and colonialism, including the notion that whiteness is the standard of normalcy, beauty, superiority, and centrality in our society. This process involves trusting Black and Indigenous families, elevating their voices, and investing in their communities. The outcome of racial equity is the adoption of breastfeeding-supportive policies and practices that eliminate negative health outcomes caused by systemic racism and realized when the social construct of race is no longer a predictor of breastfeeding outcomes.

These webinars are designed to support practice change among peer counselors, maternity care nurses, and home visitors. In providing these webinars, we are committed to 4 core values: access, evidence, equity, and relevance.



"The Great Lakes Breastfeeding Webinars provide free continuing education for all participants from lactation consultants to nurses to social workers to dietitians, community health workers, and physicians. However, the webinars are so much more than continuing education. Each webinar offers participants the opportunity to engage with current issues in lactation through an equity lens from presenters that are meaningfully engaged in the work in their own communities. They encompass global issues at the community level and offer both clinical and practical ways to support and promote chest/breastfeeding families while exploring ways to reimagine policy and practice around equitable lactation support."



## **SUCCESSES**


#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

The 2022 Great Lakes Breastfeeding Webinars reached more participants and provided more continuing education certificates compared to any past year. Throughout the year, original on-demand webinars enabled participants to earn free continuing education for seven distinct health professions, making it easier to maintain/renew credentials when they may have otherwise been unable to, especially in light of financial, travel, and COVID-related restrictions during the past three years. The webinars amplified the voices of Black and Indigenous presenters on topical issues of lactation through an equity lens with the goal of diversifying the field of lactation.

#### **NEW PARTNERSHIP WITH YOLO**

#### **TRAPCHAT**


TrapChat is presented on the YOLO Facebook page via Facebook Live every Friday evening and is an authentic space for families and birthing parents to tune in, connect, and contribute, based on their own comfort level. YOLO develops the topics and then connects with panelists who meet the criteria of being relatable, honest, and equipped to talk about the subject matter through a lens of evidence and equity. Topics are often an expansion of and deeper dive into recent Great Lakes Breastfeeding Webinars, ranging from fatherhood, doulas, miscarriage, COVID-19, formula shortage, and so on.

# TWO 45-HOUR CLINICAL LACTATION SUPPORT COURSES

Two courses are currently available: Birth and Breastfeeding Specialist Course for doulas and Reviving The Village Course for community members, grassroots organizations, and breastfeeding supporters that are in search of growing professionally. Both courses are offered virtually and include designated certifications. They are interactive, designed to enhance counseling and teaching skills through a lens of racial equity, and provide breastfeeding supporters with insight to authentically connect with families and other professionals.


