Served alongside local lactation supporters to provide direct consultation to Michigan Department of Corrections to support with implementation of Mama's Mobile Milk, a human milk transport service at Huron Valley Women's Prison.



Testified at the state Capitol for the expansion of the 2014 Breastfeeding Anti-Discrimination Act to include public milk expression through Michigan SB 351.



Launched a new learning platform for the Great Lakes Breastfeeding Webinars to increase accessibility for learners while continuing to offer 7 types of free continuing education.



Took action on the priority areas of child care, workplace, and child custody to educate and support human-milk feeding across diverse sectors of influence.
